

Tobishima Village is located in the southwestern part of Aichi Prefecture. Adjacent to Nagoya City, it is a small village with a population of less than 5,000. It is developing as a distribution base in the Chubu region where a container terminal has been developed. It is a unique area with two sides, where "agriculture" and "engineering" live together, which is rare in Japan.

Tobishima Village is a land where most of its area has been cleared. The reclamation project has been carried out since the Edo period, and since it was born by the great merger of towns and villages in 1902, it has developed as a pure rural area of the water town while overcoming repeated disasters. After that, in 1971, the west 2nd and 4th wards of the western coastal area of

Nagoya Port were incorporated to form the current village area, and it has grown into an area that plays a part in Nagoya Port, which is growing as an international comprehensive port.

Tobishima Village, which is developing as a prosperous and vibrant village through the tireless efforts of our predecessors, will be transformed into a "disaster-resistant village", "lively and attractive village", and "human resource development". Based on these three visions, we will develop into an increasingly attractive village.

We hope that this handbook will help you deepen your understanding of Tobishima Village and give you a feel for the charm of Tobishima Village.
